PRIVACY STATEMENT FAIR PROCESSING NOTICE

Dear Parent,

The following is a notice that we are required to issue to the parents of children under 12 years of age that attend our school.

Dale House School processes personal data about its pupils and is a “data controller” in respect of this for the purposes of the Data Protection Act 1998 and the Education Act 1996. It processes this data to:

- Support pupil teaching and learning.
- Monitor and report on pupil progress.
- Maintain a safe environment for pupils, parents and staff both inside and outside school (24 hour CCTV in operation).
- Provide appropriate pastoral care.
- Assess the quality of our services.
- Comply with the law regarding data sharing.

This data includes personal information (such as name, unique pupil number, address and contact details), national curriculum assessment results, attendance information, any exclusion information, where pupils go after they leave us, and personal characteristics (such as ethnicity, language, nationality, country of birth), any special educational needs a pupil may have, and relevant medical information.

This data may only be used or passed on for specific purposes allowed by law. From time to time the school is required to pass on some of this data to Local Authorities (LA), the Department for Education (DfE) and to agencies that are prescribed by law such as Ofsted, the Skills Funding Agency (SFA), the Young People's Learning Agency (YPLA), the Department of Health & Social Care (DHSC) and Clinical commissioning groups (CCGs). All these are data controllers in respect of the data they receive and are subject to the same legal constraints in how they deal with the data. This only includes the name and address of the child, contact details for their parents or carers (with parental responsibility) and the contact details of the school.

Decisions on whether DfE releases this personal data to third parties are subject to a robust approval process and are based on a detailed assessment of who is requesting the data, the purpose for which it is required, the level and sensitivity of data requested and the arrangements in place to store and handle the data. To be granted access to pupil level data, requestors must comply with strict terms and conditions covering the confidentiality and handling of data, security arrangements and retention and use of the data.

Pupils, as data subjects, have certain rights under the Data Protection Act, including a general right to be given access to personal data held about them by any data controller.

The presumption is that by the age of 12 a child has sufficient maturity to understand their rights and to make an access request themselves if they wish. A parent would normally be expected to make a request on a child's behalf if the child is younger.
